1. Grimshaw Gravels Aquifer Source Water Protection Plan

Rick Keillor brought forward this information and asked if members knew of someone who lives on the aquifer, that can qualify for surface water runoff and water percolation studies.

Christi Friesen mentioned that Henry Vos invited Chrystia Freeland, Deputy Prime Minister of Canada to sit with select farmers in the region to better understand issues producers have. Members discussed carbon tax on grain drying (propane/gas), market access for grains and peas, etc, rail issues, specialized machine codes on equipment, legislation currently in place, bandaid solutions, and investors (eg Manulife) purchasing land in small areas like Deadwood to then rent out to individuals who are cannot afford to buy. Other provinces are lobbying the government for the future of farming.

Christi also discussed Bell Lets Talk and mental health since many are coming off of a bad harvest, as well as Farm Tech where she personally met Minister of Agriculture and Forestry, Devin Dresheen.
