<b><u>PURPOSE OF THIS POLICY:</u></b> To provide administration with guidance on requests received from community groups raising money by cleaning municipal road ditches or the municipal landfill.		
<b><u>POLICY STATEMENT:</u></b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Number of roadside miles to be cleaned each year will not exceed 20 miles or 10 miles if the landfill also requires cleaning. The CAO, Director of Agricultural Services and the Public Works Foreman will, each year, determine if any roadsides or the landfill area around the current pit require cleaning.</li><li>2. Requests by community groups will be dealt with on a first come, first serve basis until the allowed miles and/or landfill area are allocated.</li><li>3. All roadside/landfill clean-up will be done on a day designated by Administration. Council will be notified in the monthly Administrator’s Report of any approved groups performing roadside/landfill clean-ups.</li><li>4. Rates of payment will be based on the annual budgeted funds allocated for this purpose and may vary from year to year. The cost of clean-up will be charged to the Public Works and/or Garbage departments.</li><li>6. The community group will haul all bagged garbage to the Municipal Landfill at Pt. SW18-81-25-W5 on the day of roadside clean-up. The Municipality is to be advised of any large items that the group was unable to pick up in road ditches.</li><li>7. The Municipality will supply garbage bags and safety vests. It is the responsibility of the group leader(s) to ensure that the clean-up is done in a safe manner and that safety vests are returned to the M.D. No hazardous, dangerous materials, needles, etc. are to be picked up.</li></ol>
