<b>TITLE:</b> Storage and Sale of Rock and Dumping of Rock and Debris on Road Allowances	<b>DATE:</b> 1984 Reviewed April 23, 2013 Amended September 11, 2018	
<b><u>PURPOSE OF THIS POLICY:</u></b> To provide guidance to Administration and Public Work on the storage and sale of rock and to control the dumping of rock and debris on road allowances.		
<b><u>POLICY STATEMENT:</u></b> <b><u>Storage and Sale of Rock</u></b> All rock picked up by Municipal staff in municipal road ditches will be stockpiled and stored at the following locations, depending on the area the staff is working in:  - Grimshaw Gravel Pit (SE33-83-22-W5) - Municipal Public Works Yard (SE31-82-24-W5) - Quinney Gravel Pit (SW25-83-25-W5) - Brownvale Gravel Pit (SW3-82-26-W5)  Under no circumstances will rock be sold or given to landowners/ratepayers or others.  Rock may be sorted with smaller rock being crushed for gravel and larger rock used for rip-rap, erosion control or used otherwise in municipal construction or repair projects.		
<b><u>Dumping of Rock and Debris on Road Allowances</u></b> In the interest of public safety and maintenance of roadside ditches and road allowances, the following procedures will be followed:  1. Sightings of dumping of rock and debris by Staff, Councillors or the general public will be reported to the Administrator.  2. The Administrator will contact the landowner and request that the rock and/or debris be removed by the landowner.  3. Should the landowner not comply with the request to clean up the rock and/or debris, the Public Works Department will do the necessary clean up and the Municipality will charge the landowner for the cost of said clean up.
